Thank you for your emails of 16 August 2022 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

1. *'What was the total amount of taxpayer funding given to Kings College for the period 1 Jan 1999 to 31 Dec 2021*
2. *'For each of the last five full years ending 31 Dec 2021 what was the total taxpayer funding given to Kings College per year'*
3. *How many private schools are left in NZ that receive taxpayer support? And what was the total taxpayer money to all private schools combined for the last five years through to 31/12/2021. Please name them as well.*
4. *How many integrated schools are there in NZ and what was their total taxpayer funding for the same five-year period above*
5. *Did Kings College notify the serious assault to MOE at the time, and if not, were they supposed to have done so*
6. *Please also confirm whether private schools which still provide a state curricular education with the support of significant taxpayer money do or do not come under the OIA. Please also confirm same for integrated schools.'*

Schools are self-governing entities and are not required to inform the Ministry of Education of incidents that occur at school. However, schools are encouraged to contact the Ministry for support when required.

The Ministry has reviewed its records and do not have a record of being informed by the school of the incident.

All school boards of state and state-integrated schools are subject to the Official Information Act. The Official Information Act does not apply to private schools.
