Chisnallwood Intermediate School Board Meeting 7th August 2022

Speaking notes

Background:

Following 2010-11 earthquakes Minister Parata initially proposed closure of Chisnallwood Intermediate. After school community consultation in 2013, decision was made to retain the school on its current site with a

Review of place and viability of the school within the new schooling network to be undertaken by 2020. This review was delayed due to CoVid.

Ministers recent decision;

Ministers decision 400 and staged from 2022-3, so that by beginning of 2025 school roll 400

Background:

- Pre and post earthquake rolls and in and out of zone students
- March 2022 roll 664, 170 were in zone

Local demand (number in zone)

2021, 340 year 7 and 8 living in zone of that 181 attend (53%)

Where do 47% attend?

- Shirley Intermediate
- Rawhiti
- Haeata Community Campus
- Waitakiri
- Marshland
- Queenspark
- Other 67 students across 25 schools.

Design of 400 student spaces would;

- Provide sufficient space for all Chisnallwoods local year 7-8 students. In fact exceeds demand
- 400, approx. 80 spaces more than all in zone including over laps (if 100% were to enrol)
 - Provisional March 2022 roll is 664, of which only 170 were in zone
 - provides sufficient space for current in zone roll and exceeds 2022 in zone roll by 230 student spaces

NOTE: neighbouring schools are not at capacity

Roll of 500

- Further increase of out of zone students

Summary, 400 roll

- Less than pre earthquake roll
- More than local in zone demand
- Retain out of zone enrolments around 230, based on patterns

Policy;

OOZ property is Board responsibility

Enrolment Scheme

Enrolments from a wide area and well outside current zone

Current scheme approved in 2005

Zone overlaps with 6 schools

March 2022 664 students, 170 in zone, 493 out of zone

NOTE need to review ES so that it better reflects current design of network of schools.

Demographics

Local area is likely to experience a decline in local age population in the short to medium term, remaining below current levels for the long term.

Intermediate Network

GCERP programme, retaining levels of intermediate provision from pre quake

3,400 spaces/retain some out of zone

Maintaining viability of network

Some intermediate schools in the future will require additional provision for roll growth in zone

Future growth will be in line with rest of country, in zone growth

Establishing rolls for ChCh we have used the following principles;

- Sustainable network of schools across the city be maintained
- Local provision for local students
- Each school has sufficient space for all learners in their catchment
- Network allows for forecast growth across the city, preventing unnecessary over-provision of capacity in any one area
- Maintain in the network approximately the same percentage of provision across each schooling type
