

TE MIRO SCHOOL (#2012)

Enrolment Scheme

Effective from **date**

The development and operation of enrolment schemes is undertaken under authority granted under Schedule 20 of the Education and Training Act 2020, which describes the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The enrolment home zone starts at the intersection of Flume Road, Te Miro Road and Aspin Road. Addresses 361 and 1/369-11/369 Flume Road are in-zone, addresses numbered 380 and below are not in-zone. Te Miro Road is in-zone.

The boundary extends north east, to include all Harbutt Road addresses (but not Lang Road or Scotsman's Valley Roads) before extending east near the boundary of Te Miro Scenic Reserve to include all Gray Road addresses and crossing Waterworks Road at number 613 Waterworks Road (613 Waterworks Road and above are included in-zone, addresses numbered 369 and below are not in-zone).

The boundary extends south to the western boundary of Te Tapui Scenic Reserve and further extends to include all Oliver Road and Brunskill Road addresses. Whitehall Road and French Pass Road addresses are not in-zone.

The zone includes all Baker Road addresses and from the Baker Road and French Pass Road intersection extends to the intersection of Gudex Road and Maungakawa Road. All Gudex Road addresses are in-zone. Only Maungakawa Road addresses above Gudex Road are in-zone.

From the Maungakawa Road and Gudex intersection the boundary moves northwest until it reaches 332 Aspin Road (even numbered Aspin Road addresses from 332 to 548 only are in-zone, odd numbered Aspin Road addresses are not in-zone).

The boundary follows Aspin Road to the intersection of Te Miro Road, Aspin Road and Flume Road, where the zone began.

Note: Both sides of all streets and roads included in the above description are included unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| First Priority | this priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education. |
| Second Priority | will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students. |
| Third Priority | will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students. |
| Fourth Priority | will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school. |
| Fifth Priority | will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| Sixth Priority | will be given to all other applicants. |

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
