

South Westland Area School (306)

Enrolment Scheme

Commences **Day Month Year**

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Year 1-6 Home Zone

All Year 1-6 students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Home Zone includes addresses on both sides of the boundary roads mentioned in the description unless otherwise stated.

Starting from the intersection of Evans Road and the Harihari Highway (SH 6), the home zone follows:

- South along the Harihari Highway (SH 6) until Robertson Road
- North along Robertson Road until Haddock Road,
 - Including Petersen Road to the east of Robertson Road
- West along Haddock Road until Wanganui Flat Road
- South along Wanganui Flat Road until Petersen Road
 - Including Wanganui Flat Road to the north of Haddock Road,
 - And including La Fontaine Road
- West along Petersen Road until Oneone Road
- South along Oneone Road until the Whataroa Highway (SH 6)
 - Including Oneone Road to the north of Petersen Road,
 - And including Poerua River Road
- West along the Whataroa Highway (SH 6) until Westland National Park
 - Including Poerua Valley Road
- From Westland National Park travels back along the Whataroa Highway (SH 6) until Main Road
- East along Main Road until the Harihari Highway (SH 6).

Year 7-8 Home Zone

All Year 7-8 students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Home Zone includes addresses on both sides of the boundary roads mentioned in the description unless otherwise stated.

Starting from where Ruatapu-Ross Road crosses the Totara River, the home zone follows:

- South along Ruatapu-Ross Road until Totara Valley Road
- East and then south along Totara Valley Road until the end of Totara Valley Road
- From the end of Totara Valley Road jumps south-west to the end of Waitaha Road

- North along Waitaha Road until the Harihari Highway (SH 6)
 - Including Douglas Road
- West and then south along the Harihari Highway (SH 6) until Robertson Road
- North along Robertson Road until Haddock Road,
 - Including Petersen Road to the east of Robertson Road
- West along Haddock Road until Wanganui Flat Road
- South along Wanganui Flat Road until Petersen Road
 - Including Wanganui Flat Road to the north of Haddock Road,
 - And including La Fontaine Road
- West along Petersen Road until Oneone Road
- South along Oneone Road until the Whataroa Highway (SH 6)
 - Including Oneone Road to the north of Petersen Road,
 - And including Poerua River Road
- West along the Whataroa Highway (SH 6) until Westland National Park
 - Including Poerua Valley Road
- From Westland National Park travels back along the Whataroa Highway (SH 6) until Main Road
- East along Main Road until the Harihari Highway (SH 6).
- North along the Harihari Highway (SH 6) until Beach Road
- North along Beach Road until Bold Head Road
 - Including Beach Road to the west of Bold Head Road
- North-east along Bold Head Road until the Harihari Highway (SH 6)
- North-east along the Harihari Highway (SH 6) until Woolhouse Road
 - Including Mcleods Road,
 - And including Donoghues Road
- North-east along Woolhouse Road until Ruatapu-Ross Road
 - Including Ross Beach Road,
 - And including Tasman Way
- East along Ruatapu-Ross Road until Totara Valley Road

Year 9-13+ Home Zone

All Year 9-13+ students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Home Zone includes addresses on both sides of the boundary roads mentioned in the description unless otherwise stated.

Starting from where Ruatapu-Ross Road crosses the Totara River, the home zone follows:

- South-west along Ruatapu-Ross Road until Aylmer Street
 - Including Totara Valley Road
- South-west along Aylmer Street until Moorhouse Street
- North-west along Moorhouse Street until the Harihari Highway (SH 6)
 - Including all side streets off of Moorhouse Street
- West along the Harihari Highway (SH 6) until the Whataroa Highway (SH 6)
 - Including all side streets off of the Harihari Highway (SH 6)
- West along the Whataroa Highway (SH 6) until the Franz Josef Highway (SH 6)
 - Including all side street off of the Whataroa Highway (SH 6)
- South along the Franz Josef Highway (SH 6) until the Fox Glacier Highway (SH 6)

- Including all side streets off of the Franz Josef Highway (SH 6)
- West along the Fox Glacier Highway (SH 6) until the Haast Highway (SH 6)
 - Including all side streets off of the Fox Glacier Highway (SH 6)
- South-west along the Haast Highway (SH 6) until and including 8756 Haast Highway (SH 6)
 - Including all side streets off the Haast Highway (SH 6) between the Fox Glacier Higher (SH 6) and 8756 Haast Highway

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the School Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following enrolment period(s) for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First Priority:** is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education
- **Second Priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third Priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth Priority:** will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth Priority:** will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school
- **Sixth Priority:** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in any priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with [instructions by the Secretary](#), under [Schedule 20, Clause 3 \(1\)](#) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants may be required to give proof of In Zone address, or proof to support their application if seeking enrolment under the Out of Zone priorities.
