



# Consultation and Engagement Years 0–10 Draft Curriculum

28 January 2026

**Priority 1:** Establishing a knowledge-rich curriculum grounded in the science of learning

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**Consultation is now open for the Years 0-10 draft NZC curriculum and we welcome your feedback and informed insights through to Friday, 24 April 2026.**

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The journey to strengthen the National Curriculum continues to reach significant milestones with the release of the draft Years 0-10 curriculum content during Term 4, 2025.

The strengthened National Curriculum will be knowledge-rich and sets out the knowledge and practices to be taught to students through responsive teaching and learning programmes. This will provide a foundation for learning that supports equity and excellence for all students.

Consultation is now open, and we welcome your feedback on this content.

Your insights are essential to shaping a curriculum that is clear, structured, evidence-based, and grounded in the science of learning.

By drawing on the expertise of teachers, principals, and a wide variety of education professionals, academics, and associations, we aim to enhance student progress and achievement.

Following consultation, the draft content will be finalised, with formal release of the updated curriculum planned for mid-2026.

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## The years 0-10 draft curriculum

As a sector we have been talking for a number of years about the need for a clearer, more detailed curriculum to support quality teaching and learning, and reduce teacher and kaiako workload.

This change means that schools and kura will not have to create teaching sequences themselves freeing up teachers and kaiako to focus on building teaching and learning programmes that bring the content to life. This will help you to engage your learners and ākonga

through structured and sequenced teaching and learning experiences that develop a love of learning and mastery of the knowledge, skills and competencies they need to be successful life-long learners.

Our work so far has been contributed to by teachers, subject-matter experts, school leaders, and curriculum design experts. It has been shared with sector representative groups for initial feedback. Through ongoing professional supports alongside monitoring and continuous improvement, we strive for a system where every student and ākonga can achieve success.

With the release of the remaining draft curriculum content, schools and kura will be able to see the whole national curriculum for Years 0 to 10.

## What does consultation and engagement look like

You will be supported to engage with the draft national curriculum throughout Term 4, 2025 and into 2026 through a range of consultation and engagement opportunities. These are designed to ensure broad and meaningful participation, gather feedback, and support a deeper understanding of the curriculum.

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## What content is available

The updated content for Years 0-10 English, Te Reo Rangatira, Mathematics and Statistics, and Pāngarau has already been released. These learning areas and wāhanga ako are not part of the current consultation. You can learn more and view this content [here](#).

Draft content for the other NZC Years 0-10 learning areas is now available so schools can provide feedback on them between now and 24 April 2026.

The draft NZC learning areas are Science, Social Sciences, Health, The Arts, Learning Languages, and Technology.

A draft of Te Mātaiaho, the framework for the New Zealand Curriculum is also available.

The draft wāhanga ako – Pūtaiao, Te Ao Māori, Waiora, Toi Ihiihi, Hāngarau, Ngā Reo, and Te Reo Pākeha are now available.

Schools and kura are invited to provide feedback on these between now and **Friday, 24 April 2026**.

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## Is this the final content?

The draft NZC Years 0-10 curriculum is presented in draft format and open for feedback. This is not yet the final version.

Following consultation, the draft content will be finalised, with formal release of the updated curriculum planned for mid-2026. It will become required teaching from the start of 2027.

- **2027:** Years 0-8 content for Science and Pūtaiao, Social Sciences and Te Ao Māori, Health & Physical Education and Waiora will need to be used from Term 1, 2027.
- **2028:** Years 0-8 content for The Arts and Toi Ihihi, Technology and Hāngarau, Learning Languages and Ngā Reo, and Te Reo Pākeha (Te Marautanga o Aotearoa only) will need to be used from Term 1, 2028.
- All Years 9-10 learning areas and wāhanga ako will need to be used from Term 1, 2027.

## What's next?

To support schools, kura, and kura hapori in engaging with the draft curriculum, a series of sessions will be offered during **Term 4, 2025** and **Term 1, 2026**. These sessions will help build understanding and familiarity with the draft content and guide participation in the consultation process.

The consultation period closes on **Friday, 24 April 2026**. Once the full and final national curriculum has been formally released by mid-2026 and is in use from 2027, the Government intends to move into a regular update cycle for the NZC and TMoA, as occurs in other jurisdictions, to avoid the need for wholesale reform.
