

Levin North School (#2888)

Enrolment Scheme Description

The commencement date of the enrolment scheme is yet to be determined.

The development and operation of enrolment schemes is undertaken under authority granted under Schedule 20 of the Education and Training Act 2020, which describes the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Zone for Levin North School has the following as its boundaries

- The boundary begins on Lindsay Road and follows Lindsay Road east to its intersection with The Avenue (State Highway 1).
- The boundary follows The Avenue south-west, including odd-numbered addresses only
- From The Avenue, the boundary turns east along Oxford Street, encompassing Tyne Street.
- The boundary continues along Stuckey Street and connects to Weraroa Road, where only even-numbered addresses are included.
- The boundary follows Weraroa Road, then continues along Trafalgar Street and Nelson Street, including even-numbered addresses only on each street
- The boundary follows Queen Street West, including even-numbered addresses only
- The boundary continues along Tiro Tiro Road, including even-numbered addresses only, then from approximately number 143 at Western Park includes both sides of the road, encompassing Ian Lane
- From Tiro Tiro Road, the boundary extends through land parcels to encompass Ryder Crescent and continues to Kawi Road, including all addresses, until reconnecting with Lindsay Road at the starting point

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which the school will publish. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

The school does not operate a special programme

Out of zone applications

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by public notice in the area served by the school. The notice will

indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First Priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary of Education up to the maximum rolls set for each programme (where applicable)
- **Second Priority:** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- **Third Priority:** must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- **Fourth Priority:** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth Priority:** must be given to any applicant who is a child of an employee of the school's board, or a child of a member of the school's board.
- **Sixth Priority:** must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Schedule 20, Clause 3 of the Education Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by appropriate public notice.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
